

## Lessons and Principles from Chapter 4:

2. God often brings confirmation when He speaks to us, especially if what we believe He wants us to do will affect other people. (Have any of you experienced confirmation from God, maybe through someone else)
3. God can make even the evil of man serve His purpose. This is one that we need to keep in mind in today's times, and this thought might just be what gets us through some very difficult times.
4. Why should we need to kill the sin rather than just defeat it? Because, if we don't kill it, it may come back to haunt us again. Does that make sense to y'all? Do you understand that sin must be totally destroyed in our lives. We can't have some little remnant hanging on, it must be totally destroyed.
5. Sisera represented the sin, and Jabin represented Satan, the sin had to be defeated and destroyed, and we know that through the final work of Christ, Satan will be destroyed. This of course comes from the analogy used by Charles Spurgeon when he preached a sermon based on this scripture.
